Legal Status

University Hospitals Bristol and Weston NHS Foundation Trust (UHBW) is a public benefit corporation authorised by NHS England, the Independent Regulator of NHS Foundation Trusts, on 1 June 2008. As a Foundation Trust, UHBW is accountable to its members and governors, who hold the Board of Directors to account and play a vital role in shaping our work.

In April 2025, UHBW and North Bristol NHS Trust (NBT) formed the Bristol NHS Group, bringing together the two major NHS providers in the region to deliver seamless, high-quality, and equitable care for every person across Bristol, Weston, South Gloucestershire, and the wider South West.

On 1st July 2026 the two Trusts formally merged by acquisition to create a single organisation, strengthening our ability to tackle health inequalities, improve outcomes, and deliver better value for patients, staff, and the public. All locations and services previously provided by North Bristol NHS Trust transferred to the new Trust.

Trust Overview

Following the merger the Trust continues to strengthen leadership, integration and collaboration across the organisation to support our workforce, deliver our clinical strategy, and ensure sustainable, high-quality services for the future. The merged organisation employs approximately 28,000 staff and operates with an annual budget of over £2.6 billion, delivering over 100 different clinical services across multiple hospital and community sites.

The Trust's general clinical services are commissioned by the Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire Integrated Care System, while specialist services are commissioned through NHS England for direct patient care. Further income is also received from other NHS commissioner organisations and for purposes other than direct patient care.

The Trust primarily provides services in the key domains of clinical service provision, teaching and learning, and research and innovation. The most significant of these with respect to income and workforce is the clinical service portfolio, consisting of general and specialised services delivered via outpatient, day care and inpatient models.

The primary sites are the Trust's Bristol City Centre, Southmead Hospital, and Weston General Hospital campuses. Care is also provided from Cossham Hospital, along with a small number of services delivered in community settings such as South Bristol Community Hospital and the Central Health Clinic.

Specialist services are delivered to a wider population throughout the South West and beyond, typically between one and five million people.

At the Bristol City campus these include children's services, cardiac services and cancer services as well as a number of smaller, but highly specialised services, some of which are nationally commissioned.

The Southmead campus is a centre of excellence for healthcare in the South West in a number of specialties, including neurosciences, thrombectomy, stroke care, orthopaedics, major trauma, pathology, plastics and burns, renal services, urology and neonatal intensive care.

The Bristol Centre for Enablement is based in Patchway and provides prosthetics, orthotics, wheelchair and electronic assistive technology for patients of all ages across the West of England.

The Head Injury Unit, a specialist outpatient multidisciplinary rehabilitation service, and the new Bristol 3D Medical Centre, are both based on the former Frenchay Hospital site (which closed in May 2014).

The Princess Royal Elective Surgical Centre opened in 2025 as a standalone service on the Southmead Hospital campus. The facilities comprise 4 surgical theatres, 40 inpatient beds (32 single rooms and 2 four-bed bays), 12 medirooms, and an x-ray machine. The Centre carries out elective Orthopaedic surgery for people across Bristol, South Gloucestershire and North Somerset.

Maternity services are provided across the Trust, including St Michael's Hospital, Southmead Hospital, Weston Hospital, Cossham Hospital and Patchway Children's Centre.

The Community Diagnostic Centres (CDC) based at Cribbs Causeway and Weston are run in partnership with InHealth to provide quicker comprehensive diagnostic provision outside of a hospital setting. They are two of five CDCs located within the South West region.

Education and workforce

Our people are the most important part of every service we provide. We aim to develop stronger academic partnerships to ensure mutual co-creation of our education priorities leading to joined up solutions for our workforce and staff retention. Research and innovation

As the largest University Teaching Trust in the South West of England, we place a strong emphasis on teaching, research and innovation. The Trust works closely with the University of Bristol and the University of the West of England (UWE) to support education and training across a wide range of professional groups, including doctors, nurses, midwives, allied health professionals, healthcare scientists, and the wider healthcare workforce.

Research is a core aspect of our activity and continues to increase in importance. We are building on established research strengths in musculoskeletal, infection and immunology, neurosciences, diabetes, respiratory medicine and urology while also developing emerging areas of focus such as anaesthetics, obstetrics and gynaecology and plastic surgery. The Trust is a full member of Bristol Health Partners and the West of England Academic Health Science Network, and hosts the newly formed Collaboration for Leadership in Applied Health Research for the West of England.

Maintaining excellence in research and fostering a strong culture of innovation are essential to developing our specialist and regional services; advancing healthcare through the recruitment of outstanding professionals, delivery of high-quality research, and translation of innovation into improved, sustainable and effective patient care.

We will focus our efforts on providing truly personalised medicine, identifying which patients are most likely to benefit from specific treatments. By strengthening our innovation capability and adopting new technologies, we aim to deliver meaningful improvements for both patients and staff.

Our Trust strategy sets clear priorities and objectives, supported by an integrated framework of aligned strategies across the organisation to support its delivery.

Use of Cannabis Based Medicinal Products

The Trust provides treatment with UK licensed cannabis based medicinal products (CBMP) in line with NHS commissioned pathways for epilepsy and cancer treatment. Licensed CBMP initiated by other NHS providers in line with NHS commissioned pathways may also be continued for inpatients to facilitate ongoing treatment.

UHBW does not initiate treatment of or supply unlicensed CBMP products. Use of a patient's own supply of unlicensed CBMP products (Schedule 2 Controlled Drugs) prescribed by another UK based provider, may be facilitated for self-administration by inpatients if assessed to be clinically suitable, the patient is able to self-administer and the unlicensed CBMP product is in a form that is suitable for use within an inpatient environment.

Description of the location

The Trust's **Bristol City campus** consists of six hospitals in the centre of Bristol with a bed-base of approximately 1,041 beds (inpatient and day case):

Bristol Royal Infirmary (BRI), including the Bristol Heart Institute (BHI)

The BRI provides general and acute medicine and surgery, specialist surgery, critical care, trauma and orthopaedics and accident and emergency services. The hospital has approximately 515 inpatient beds (51 of which are for critical care) plus a further 42 day-case beds and a Discharge Lounge containing chairs for patients who no longer need to be on a ward. The Bristol Heart Institute is the centre for cardiothoracic services for the northern part of the South West region.

Bristol Eye Hospital (BEH)

Bristol Eye Hospital is one of the country's leading specialist hospitals. The hospital has approximately 24 ophthalmic consultants supported by a wide range of staff including orthoptists, optometrists, pharmacists and nurse practitioners. The Bristol Eye Hospital offers a daytime emergency assessment and treatment service, 7 days a week. The hospital has 11 inpatient and 16 day-case beds. The BEH is the region's leading ophthalmology centre.

Bristol Royal Hospital for Children (BRHC)

The Bristol Royal Hospital for Children (BRHC) provides a local service for Bristol children and a referral service for specialist care for families across the South West and nationally. The hospital has approximately 178 inpatient beds (including 18 critical care) and 37 day case beds. The only dedicated children's hospital in the South West of England, BRHC is the regional centre for a wide range of specialist paediatric services and is the base for the internationally renowned bone marrow transplant unit. The intensive care unit provides the highest level of specialist paediatric critical care.

Bristol Haematology and Oncology Centre (BHOC)

BHOC provides inpatient and day case chemotherapy treatment and radiotherapy, inpatient oncology and day case oncology, a full range of haematology services (benign and malignant disease), including adult stem cell transplantation (with an on-site apheresis unit) and provides comprehensive care centre for haemophiliacs, as well as comprehensive palliative care based in the BHOC with outreach across the hospital. The hospital has approximately 58 inpatient beds and 33 day case beds.

St Michael's Hospital (StMH)

StMH provide a range of facilities including maternity services (a midwifery led unit and central delivery suite), gynaecology and gynae-oncology, day surgery, children's and adult audiology, ear nose and throat outpatients and clinical genetics. The hospital is a regional referral unit for high-risk pregnancies, surgical, cardiac and extreme premature neonatal care, and for foetal medicine. The hospital has approximately 125 beds (including 103 maternity/obstetrics, 31 neonates and 22 gynaecology).

University of Bristol Dental Hospital (BDH)

BDH provides routine and specialist clinical dental services for all ages, for the South West of England, as well as conducting research. The hospital also provides Emergency Dental Services for patients with specific life-threatening dental conditions. There are four day-case beds within the hospital to provide dental treatment for paediatric patients who require general anaesthetic.

Community services

Community services are delivered at the South Bristol Community Hospital and the Central Health Clinic.

Critical Care Ambulance Retrieval Services

Southwest Neonatal Advice and Retrieval (SoNAR), Wales and West Acute Transport for Children (WATCH), and Retrieve, are the Services responsible for transferring critically ill patients across the Southwest of England. WATCH also provides cover for hospitals in South Wales. SoNAR is the service commissioned for transfers of babies in or out of a neonatal unit, WATCH provide paediatric critical care transport, and Retrieve is responsible for providing adult critical care transfers. The three Services operate out of a shared base in Bristol, with Retrieve and SoNAR also having bases in Launceston and Plymouth respectively.

Extra Corporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO)

A single joint ECMO and Severe Acute Respiratory Failure (SARF) service in Bristol went live in 2022, following the NHS England Specialised Commissioning team's substantial investment in the existing nationally commissioned ECMO centres. This began as a joint service between UHBW and NBT based on the UHBW site, with workforce provided by both NBT and UHBW, covered by a collaboration agreement and a joint programme board.

Temporary arrangements

Additional temporary arrangements are in place or being sought for the following at additional premises:

- Imaging - The radiology service at Weston has been utilising Practice Plus at Emerson's Green to support the elective recovery for non- obstetric ultrasound imaging. This arrangement is on a rolling contract which will be reviewed at the end of 2026.
- Paediatric outpatients UHBW Education & Research Centre – with the need to expand our Emergency Department within level 3 of The Bristol Royal Hospital for Children,

part of level one of the Research & Education centre was repurposed in December 2024 to accommodate paediatric outpatient. 'Fairground' outpatients encompasses; 8 clinic rooms, a phlebotomy room, locked clinical room for drugs, a dirty utility and a reception area. Bathrooms for patients and baby changing facilities are situated on the ground floor opposite. It holds many of the paediatric specialty clinics except for Cardiology, Burns and plastics and Trauma and Orthopaedics who remain onsite at BRHC due to the imaging and radiology support needed. The department is planned to accommodate paediatric clinics for a further two years, prior to a large expansion of a purpose-built paediatric Outpatient facility.

Southmead Hospital

Southmead Hospital is the Trust's northern campus. It currently has 812 beds (not including maternity beds) and approximately 12,500 staff (120 nationalities) who provide healthcare services to the residents of Bristol, South Gloucestershire and North Somerset - a combined population of around 900,000 people.

Specialist services are also provided such as neurosciences, renal, trauma, and plastics/burns which are provided to people from across the South West and in some instances nationally or internationally.

The campus is a major trauma centre for the South West, with provision for helicopter arrivals.

Princess Royal Bristol Surgical Centre

Bristol Surgical Centre is a standalone Elective Centre on the Southmead Hospital site. The facilities comprise 4 surgical theatres, 40 inpatient beds in 32 single rooms and two four bedded bays, 12 medirooms and an x-ray machine. Elective (planned) Orthopaedic surgery will be undertaken in the centre for people in Bristol, North Somerset, and South Gloucestershire.

Bristol Centre for Enablement (BCE)

Services include prosthetics, orthotics, wheelchairs & special seating, wheelchair repairs, electronic assistive technology and the AAC (Augmentative and Assistive Communication) West of England Specialist Team (WEST).

Bristol Brain Centre (NMSK)

The Bristol Brain Centre is a specialist Neurological Treatment Centre for patients with complex forms of Parkinson's Disease, Multiple Sclerosis and Dementia.

Macmillan Wellbeing Centre

The Centre provides support for patients and carers going through the cancer pathway.

Outpatient Clinics

Satellite outpatient clinics, managed from Southmead Hospital, are also provided at a number of places within the local area, including on a regular basis at the following places:

- **Frenchay Hospital:** Beckspool Road, Frenchay, Bristol, BS16 1ND - the Head Injury Therapy Unit provides outpatient services at the Frenchay site. The Head Injury Therapy Unit is a specialist outpatient multidisciplinary rehabilitation service for people who have had a brain injury. It also hosts the new Bristol 3D Medical Centre.
